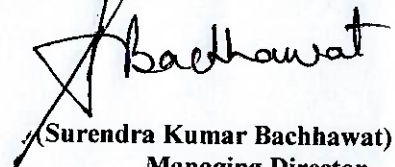

1. The Ministry of Corporate Affairs, Government of India ("MCA") has, vide its circular No. 3/2025 dated September 22, 2025, read with circulars dated April 8, 2020, April 13, 2020, May 5, 2020, January 13, 2021, December 8, 2021, December 28, 2022, September 25, 2023 and September 19, 2024 (collectively referred to as "MCA Circulars"), inter-alia allowed conducting of AGM through Video Conferencing/ Other Audio-Visual Means ("VC/OAVM") facilities without the physical presence of the Members, Directors, Auditors and other persons at common venue. In compliance with the provisions of the Act, SEBI Listing Regulations, MCA Circulars and SEBI Circular and all other relevant circulars issued from time to time, the 46th AGM of the Company is being conducted through VC / OAVM facility. Hence, Members can attend and participate in the AGM through VC/ OAVM only. The deemed venue for the 46th AGM shall be the Regd. Office of the Company i.e., "Ideal Plaza", South Block, 2nd Floor, S-207 & 209, 11/1, Sarat Bose Road, Kolkata-700020.
 2. **Pursuant to the provisions of the Act, a member entitled to attend and vote at the AGM is entitled to appoint a proxy to attend and vote on his/her behalf and the proxy need not be a Member of the Company. Since this AGM is being held pursuant to the MCA Circulars through VC / OAVM, physical attendance of Members has been dispensed with. Accordingly, the facility for appointment of proxies by the Members will not be available for the AGM and hence the Proxy Form and Attendance Slip are not annexed to this Notice.**
 3. Information pursuant to Regulation 36 of SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 and Secretarial Standards on General Meetings issued by the Institute of Company Secretaries of India, in respect of the Director seeking appointment / re-appointment at this AGM, forms part of the Notice.
 4. The Notice of the 46th AGM and instruction for e-voting, is being sent by electronic mode to all the members whose email addresses are registered with the Company/Depository Participant(s) for communication purpose and a letter providing the web-link, including the exact path, where complete details of the Annual Report of the Company is available is being sent to all those shareholder(s) who have not so registered;
 5. The attendance through VC/OAVM is restricted and hence will be made available to only 1000 Members on first come first served basis. However, attendance of Members holding 2% or more of the shares of the Company, Institutional Investors as on closure of the business hours on 20th day of August, 2026, Promoters, Directors, Key Managerial Personnel, the Chairpersons of the Audit Committee, Nomination and Remuneration Committee and Stakeholders Relationship Committee, Auditors, Scrutinizer, etc. are allowed to attend the AGM without restriction of first come first served basis. The Members can join the AGM in the VC/OAVM mode 15 minutes before and after the scheduled time of the commencement of the Meeting by following the procedure mentioned in the Notice.
- Members desirous of obtaining any information concerning the accounts and operations of the Company are requested to address their questions in writing to the Secretary of the Company by 20th day of August, 2026.
6. Members who would like to express their views or ask questions during the AGM may register themselves as a speaker by sending their request from their registered email address mentioning their name, DP ID and Client ID/folio number, PAN, mobile number at deeplokfinancial@gmail.com on or before 20th day of August, 2026 (5:00p.m. IST). Those Members who have registered themselves as a speaker will only be allowed to express their views /ask questions during the AGM. The Company reserves the right to restrict the number of speakers depending on the availability of time for the AGM. In the interest of time, each speaker is requested to express his / her views in 2 – 3 minutes.

7. However, shareholders may post their comments/queries (not more than 150 characters) in the chat box available on the Video Conferencing interface. Message posted by the shareholders will be dealt with accordingly.
8. Corporate Members are required to send to the company a duly certified copy of the Board Resolution, pursuant to Section 113 of the Companies Act, 2013, authorizing their representative to attend and vote at the AGM.
9. In case of joint holders attending the meeting, the Member whose name appears as the first holder in the order of names as per the Register of Members of the Company will be entitled to vote.
10. The Company's shares are available in demat mode. The shares of the company can be dematerialized under ISIN: INE875C01013. In terms of SEBI Circular, physical shares cannot be transferred on or after 01.04.2019. Members are requested to dematerialize the shares for operational convenience.

The Securities and Exchange Board of India vide its Circular No. SEBI/HO/MIRSD/MIRSD-PoD/P/CIR/2025/97 dated July 2, 2025 ("Circular") has facilitated mechanism for a "Special Window for Re-lodgement of Transfer Requests of Physical Shares" and accordingly all physical share transfer deeds lodged for transfer with the Company or its Registrar and Transfer Agent (RTA) prior to discontinuation of physical mode of transfer, i.e., April 01, 2019 and rejected/returned by the Company/RTA due to deficiency in the documents and was required to be re-lodged with requisite documents on or before the cut-off date fixed for re-lodgement of such transfer deeds, i.e., March 31, 2021; have been provided with an opportunity to re-lodge the same with the Company/RTA during a special window period of six months from July 07, 2025 till January 06, 2026. During this period, the securities that are re-lodged for transfer (including those requests that are pending with the listed company / RTA, as on date) shall be issued only in demat mode. However, due process shall be followed for such transfer-cum-demat requests. For further details you may contact the Company Secretary of the Company or the Registrar and Transfer Agent of the Company. A copy of the Circular is also available on the website of the Company at www.deeplokfinancialservices.com. To facilitate ease of investing for holders of securities in physical form, SEBI, vide its circular dated 30th January 2026, has opened an additional special window for a period of one (1) year, from 5th February 2026 to 4th February 2027, for lodgement of transfer deeds and dematerialisation of physical securities. This window is applicable to physical securities that were sold or purchased prior to 1 April 2019. The securities so transferred shall be mandatorily credited to the transferee only in demat mode and shall be under lock-in for a period of one year from the date of registration of transfer and such securities shall not be transferred / lien -marked / pledged during the said lock-in period. However, the claimant must have the original security certificate with them and the same should not have been transferred to Investor Education and Protection Fund for any reason.

11. The Register of Directors and Key Managerial Personnel and their shareholding maintained under Section 170 of the Act, the Register of Contracts or Arrangements in which the directors are interested, maintained under Section 189 of the Act, and the relevant documents referred to in the Notice will be available electronically for inspection by the members during the AGM.
12. Shareholders are informed that in terms of the provisions of the Listing Regulations, the Company is required to intimate the Stock Exchanges the details of the agreements entered into by the shareholders, promoters, promoter group entities, related parties, directors, key managerial personnel and employees of the Company or of its holding, subsidiary or associate company, among themselves or with the Company or with a third party, solely or jointly, which, either directly or indirectly or potentially or whose purpose and effect is to, impact the management or control of the Company or impose any restriction or create any liability upon

the Company, including disclosure of any rescission, amendment or alteration of such agreements thereto, whether or not the Company is a party to such agreements. Accordingly, it is hereby advised to the shareholders to inform the Company about any such agreement to which the Company is not a party, within two working days of entering into such agreements or signing an agreement to enter into such agreements. The Company will inform the details of such agreements to the Stock Exchanges on it becoming aware of it within the prescribed timelines.

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 108 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Rule 20 of the Companies (Management and Administration) Rules, 2014, the Company is offering e-voting facility to its Members in respect of the businesses to be transacted at the 46th Annual General Meeting scheduled to be held on Thursday, the 27th day of August, 2026 at 11.30 a.m. The Company has engaged the services of Central Depository Services (India) Limited ("CDSL") to provide e-voting facilities. The e-voting particulars are set out below:

- (i) The remote e-voting period begins on Monday, 24th August, 2026 from 09:00 a.m. (IST) and ends on Wednesday, 26th August, 2026 up to 5:00 p.m. (IST). During this period members of the Company, holding shares either in physical form or in dematerialized form, as on the cut-off date i.e., 20th August, 2026 may cast their vote electronically. The remote e-voting module shall be disabled by CDSL for voting thereafter. 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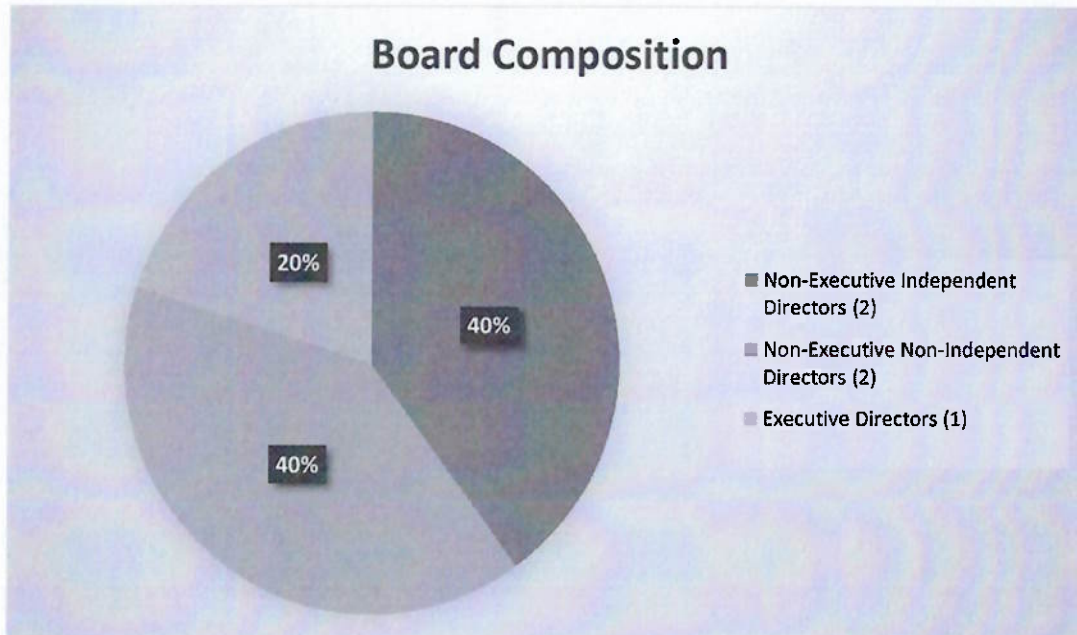

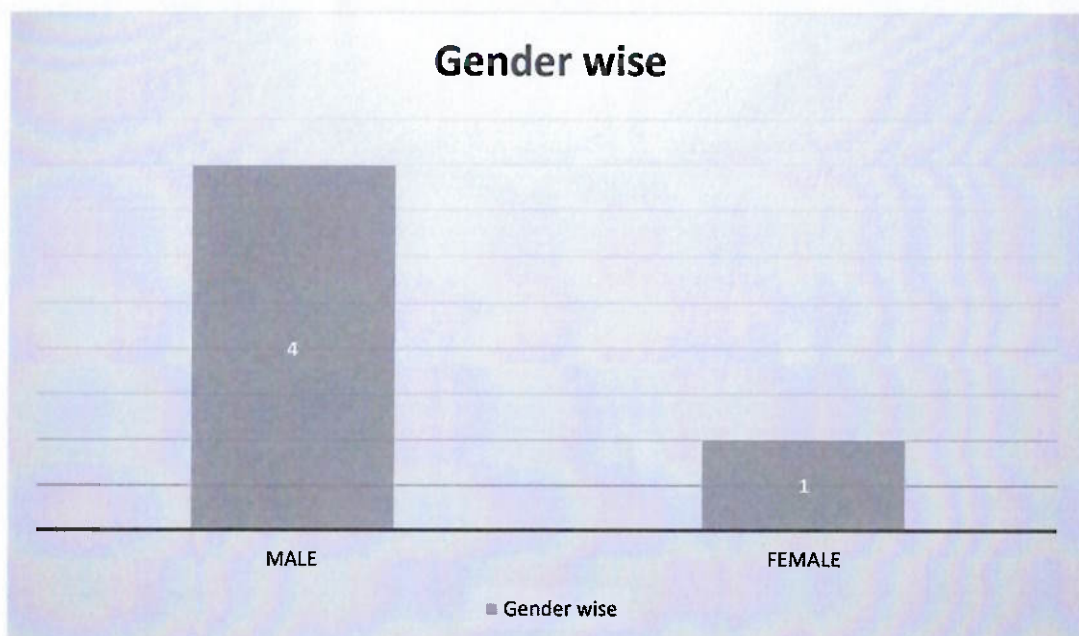

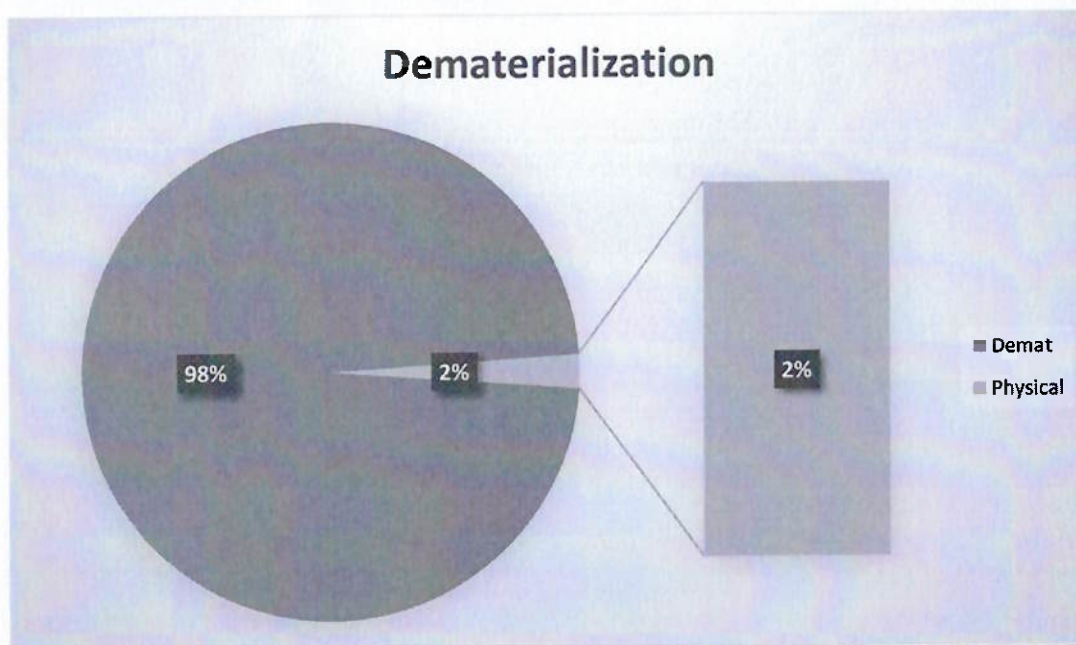

- **Financialization of Savings:** The consistent flow of domestic capital into equity markets enhances valuation across sectors, creating lucrative exit and entry points for corporate investment portfolios.
- **Diversification:** Opportunities exist to explore alternative asset classes within permissible statutory bounds to improve portfolio yields.

• **Threats:**

- **Market Volatility:** Portfolio returns are susceptible to short-term market corrections driven by global geopolitical tensions or inflationary pressures.
- **Regulatory Changes:** Stringent updates in RBI regulations and compliance requirements for NBFCs could elevate operational and compliance overheads.
- **Interest Rate Risks:** Fluctuations in systemic interest rates influence both market liquidity and equity valuations.

3. Segment-wise / Product-wise Performance

The Company operates within a single reportable primary business segment: Investments in Shares and Securities, as an NBFC registered with the Reserve Bank of India. Accordingly, disclosure of segment-wise or product-wise performance under Ind AS 108 (Operating Segments) is not applicable/required to be given separately, and no additional segmental information is presented beyond the financial statements.

4. Outlook

Having regard to the Company's business model, which is centred on investment income rather than operating revenue from a specific product or service line, the Company's near-term outlook remains linked to the trajectory of Indian capital markets. The Board continues to focus on preservation of capital, prudent portfolio management and maintaining a near-zero debt, reserve-backed balance sheet.

5. Risks and Concerns

The Company is exposed to risks that are typical of an investment-holding NBFC, including:

- Market risk – fluctuations in the market value of the investment portfolio, directly affecting total income, profit before tax and other comprehensive income.
- Concentration risk – dependence of income on the performance of a relatively limited set of investee companies/instruments.
- Liquidity risk – the extent to which investments held can be realised at fair value within a reasonable time frame, if required.
- Regulatory and compliance risk – changes in RBI regulations applicable to NBFCs and SEBI (LODR) Regulations applicable to listed entities, including the ongoing delisting process.

The Board, through the Audit Committee, periodically reviews the risk assessment and minimisation procedures placed before it, and has adopted steps for framing, implementing and monitoring the Company's risk management plan, as stated elsewhere in the Directors' Report.

6. Internal Control Systems and their adequacy

The Company maintains an established internal financial control framework designed to ensure proper recording of operational and financial metrics, accurate accounting, and asset protection.

- **Compliance:** Systems are designed to ensure seamless adherence to various regulatory and statutory mandates.
- **Oversight:** M/s. Shyamsukha Associates, Chartered Accountants, serves as the Internal Auditor. Internal audit reviews and findings are systematically placed before the Audit Committee. Corrective actions are implemented continuously to refine operational efficiency and strengthen internal governance.

7. Financial Review & Operational Performance

During the year under review, total revenue recorded a marginal reduction, moving to Rs. 937.60 lakhs compared to Rs. 981.99 lakhs in the previous financial year. Profit After Tax (PAT) stood at Rs. 623.84 lakhs, compared to Rs. 702.52 lakhs in FY 2024-25, primarily owing to variations in operational yields and baseline effects from exceptional items in the preceding year.

Note on Reserves: To secure financial stability and build deep reserves, the Company chose to omit a dividend distribution for FY 2025-26. Out of total current profits, Rs.124.77 Lakhs was transferred to Special Reserve (in terms of Section 45-IC of the Reserve Bank of India Act, 1934), and Rs.62.38 Lakhs was transferred to General Reserves, taking accumulated reserves to Rs.11,181.96 Lakhs.

8. Material Developments in Human Resources / Industrial Relations

The Company maintains cordial relations with its employees. Given the nature and scale of the Company's operations as an investment-holding NBFC, the employee base is small, and the Company had no female employees on its rolls during the year under review. No industrial relations issues were reported during the year. Human resource policies, including the policy on prevention of sexual harassment at the workplace, are in place and are administered by the Internal Complaints Committee as stated elsewhere in the Directors' Report.

¹ The Operating Profit Margin (Profit before exceptional items and tax / Total Income) increased from 48.9% in FY 2024-25 to 82.2% in FY 2025-26, a relative increase of approximately 33.3%, which exceeds the 25% variance threshold prescribed under Schedule V(B) to the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015.

The increase is primarily attributable to a decline in Other Expenses to Rs. 100.94 lakhs in FY 2025-26 from Rs. 443.10 lakhs in FY 2024-25, while Total Income remained broadly stable (Rs. 937.60 lakhs vs. Rs. 981.99 lakhs). Employee benefit expense and depreciation were not material contributors to the variance; each having remained largely stable between the two years.

10. Details of any Change in Return on Net Worth

Return on Net Worth (approximated as set out in paragraph 9 above) declined from approximately 6.6% in FY 2024-25 to approximately 5.5% in FY 2025-26, a relative decline of about 1.1%, primarily on account of the non-recurrence of the prior year's exceptional item and the consequent decline in profit after tax, partly offset by an increase in net worth on account of profits retained during the year.

11. Disclosure of Accounting Treatment

In the preparation of the financial statements for the year ended 31st March, 2026, the Company has followed the recognition and measurement principles laid down in the Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS) prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015, as amended. No treatment different from that prescribed in any applicable Accounting Standard has been followed in the preparation of the financial statements, and the Statutory Auditors have issued an unmodified opinion thereon. Accordingly, no disclosure under this head, as contemplated under Schedule V(B) to the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, arises for the year under review.

Material Accounting Policies**1 General Information**

Deeplok Financial Services Limited (the 'Company') is a public limited Company, incorporated and domiciled in India. The equity shares of the Company are listed. The registered office of the Company is located at 11/1, Sarat Bose Road, South Block, 2nd Floor, Kolkata 700020, West Bengal, India.

The Company is Non Banking Financial Company having certificate of registration from RBI vide no-05.01925 and mainly engaged in investment in shares and securities.

The functional and presentation currency of the Company is Indian Rupee ("INR") which is the currency of the primary economic environment in which the Company operates.

The financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2026 were approved by the Board of Directors and authorised for issue on 28th May 2026.

2 Significant Accounting Policies

The material accounting policies applied by the Company in the preparation of its financial statements are listed below. Such accounting policies have been applied consistently to all the periods presented in these financial statements unless otherwise indicated.

2.1 Presentation of financial statements

The Balance Sheet, Statement of Profit and Loss and Statement of changes in Equity are prepared and presented in the format prescribed in the Division III of Schedule III to the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act"). The Statement of Cash Flows has been prepared and presented as per the requirements of Ind AS. Amounts in the financial statements are presented in Indian Rupees in Lakh.

2.2 Basis of preparation

These financial statements have been prepared to comply in all material aspects with Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS) notified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 (the Act), Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 and Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Amendment Rules, 2016 and other relevant provisions of the Act.

The Company had been preparing its financial statements upto the year 31 March 2019, as per Companies (Accounting Standard) Rules, 2006 and other relevant provisions of the Act (hereinafter referred to as Previous GAAP/Indian GAAP).

2.3 Measurement of fair values

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date, regardless of whether that price is directly observable or estimated using another valuation technique.

Fair value measurements under Ind AS are categorised into Level 1, 2, or 3 based on the degree to which the inputs to the fair value measurements are observable and the significance of the inputs to the fair value measurement in its entirety, which are described as follows:

- Level 1: inputs are quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the Company can access at measurement date
- Level 2: inputs are inputs, other than quoted prices included within level 1, that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly; and
- Level 3: inputs are unobservable inputs for the valuation of assets or liabilities that the Company can access at measurement date.

2.4 Use of estimates and judgements

The preparation of financial statements requires the management of the Company to make judgements, assumptions and estimates that affect the reported balances of assets and liabilities and disclosures relating to the contingent liabilities as at the date of the financial statements and reported amounts of income and expenses for the reporting period. The application of accounting policies that require critical accounting estimates involving complex and subjective judgments and the use of assumptions in the financial statements have been disclosed as applicable in the respective notes to accounts. Accounting estimates could change from period to period. Future results could differ from these estimates. Appropriate changes in estimates are made as the Management becomes aware of changes in circumstances surrounding the estimates. Changes in estimates are reflected in the financial statements in the period in which changes are made and, if material, their effects are disclosed in the notes to the financial statements.

2.5 Income Taxes:-

The Company's tax jurisdiction is India. Significant judgements are involved in determining the provisions for income taxes including amount expected to be paid or recovered for uncertain tax positions.

3 Summary of significant accounting policies

This note provides a list of the significant accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

3.1 Financial Instruments

Financial assets and financial liabilities are recognised when the Company becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument. Financial assets and liabilities are initially measured at fair value. Transaction costs that are directly attributable to the acquisition or issue of financial assets and financial liabilities (other than financial assets and financial liabilities at fair value through profit or loss) are added to or deducted from the fair value measured on initial recognition of financial asset or financial liability. The transaction costs directly attributable to the acquisition of financial assets and financial liabilities at fair value through profit and loss are immediately recognised in the statement of profit and loss.

i) Financial Assets**Subsequent Recognition**

The classification of financial assets depends on the Company's business model for managing financial assets and the contractual terms of cash flow.

The financial assets are classified in the following categories:

- Financial assets measured at amortised cost,
- financial assets measured at fair value through profit and loss (FVTPL), and
- financial assets measured at fair value through other comprehensive income (FVOCI).



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Material Accounting Policies

Financial assets measured at amortised cost

Assets that are held for collection of contractual cash flows where those flows represent solely payments of principal and interest are measured at amortised cost. After initial measurement, such financial assets are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method. The losses arising from impairment are recognised in the Statement of Profit & Loss.

Trade receivables are recognised initially at fair value and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method less provision for impairment, if any.

Financial instruments measured at FVTPL

Financial instruments included within FVTPL category are measured initially as well as at each reporting period at fair value plus transaction costs as applicable. Fair value movements are recorded in Statement of Profit & Loss.

Financial assets at FVOCI

Financial assets are measured at FVOCI if these financial assets are held within a business model whose objective is achieved by both collecting contractual cash flows and selling financial assets and the contractual terms of the financial asset give rise on specified dates to cash flows that are solely payments of principal and interest on the principal amount outstanding.

Investment in Bonds (other than Tax free) and Mutual fund

Investment in Equity Oriented Mutual Funds, Debt Oriented Mutual fund and Bonds (other than Tax free) are classified as FVTPL and measured at fair value with all changes recognised in the statement of profit and loss.

Investment in Tax Free Bonds and Non- Convertible Preference Shares

Investment in Tax Free Bonds and Non- Convertible Preference Shares are measured at Cost.

Investment in Equity

Investment in Equity are classified as FVTOCI and measured at fair value with all changes recognised in Other Comprehensive Income.

Investments in Associates

The Company has elected to measure Investment in associates at cost.

Other Unquoted Equity Investments

The Company has elected to measure Investment in Unquoted Equity Shares at cost.

De-recognition of financial assets

The company de-recognises a financial asset when the contractual rights to the cash flows for the financial assets expires or it transfer the financial assets and such transfer qualifies for de-recognition under Ind AS 109- Financial instruments.

All investments other than those disclosed otherwise are carried at cost less accumulated impairment losses, if any. Where an indication of impairment exists, the carrying amount of the investment is assessed and is written down immediately to its recoverable amount. On disposal of such investments, the difference between net disposal proceeds and the carrying amounts are recognised in the Statement of Profit and Loss.

Impairment of financial assets

The Company assesses on a forward looking basis the expected credit losses associated with its assets carried at amortised cost. The impairment methodology applied depends on whether there has been a significant increase in credit risk.

Only for Loans the implied approach of life time expected credit losses is recognised from initial recognition of the receivables as required by Ind AS 109- financial instruments.

Impairment loss allowance recognised / reversed during the year is charged / written back to Statement of Profit & Loss.

Where a financial instrument includes both a drawn and an undrawn component and the Company cannot identify the ECL on the loan commitment separately from those on the drawn component, the Company presents a combined loss allowance for both components under "provisions".

ii) Financial liabilities

Subsequent Measurement

Financial liabilities are subsequently carried at amortized cost using the effective interest method.

Borrowings are initially recognised at fair value, net of transaction costs incurred. Borrowings are subsequently measured at amortised cost. Any difference between the proceeds (net of transaction costs) and the redemption amount is recognised in profit or loss over the period of the borrowings using effective interest method.

Borrowings are classified as current liabilities unless the company has an unconditional right to defer settlement of the liability for at least 12 months after the reporting period. Where there is a breach of a material provision of a long term loan arrangement on or before the end of the reporting period with the effect that the liability becomes payment on demand on the reporting date, the entity does not classify the liability as current, if the lender agreed, after the reporting period and before the approval of the financial statement for issue, not to demand payment as a consequence of the breach.

For Trade and other payables maturing within one year from the balance sheet date, the carrying amount approximates fair value to short-term maturity of these instruments.



Material Accounting Policies

Derecognition of financial liabilities

The Company derecognises financial liabilities when, and only when, the Company's obligations are discharged, cancelled or they expire or it transfers the financial assets and such transfer qualifies for de-recognition under Ind AS 109- Financial Instruments. All investments other than those disclosed otherwise are carried at cost less accumulated impairment losses, if any. Where an indication of impairment exists, the carrying amount of the investment is assessed and is written down immediately to its recoverable amount. On disposal of such investments, the difference between net disposal proceeds and the carrying amounts are recognised in the Statement of Profit and Loss.

Offsetting Financial instruments

Financial assets and liabilities are offset and the net amount is reported in the balance sheet where there is a legally enforceable right to offset the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis or realise the asset and settle the liability subsequently. The legally enforceable right must not be contingent on future events and must be enforceable in the normal course of business and in event of default, insolvency or bankruptcy of the company or the counter party.

3.2 Income recognition

a) Interest income

The Company recognises interest income using Effective Interest Rate (EIR) on all financial assets subsequently measured at amortised cost or fair value through other comprehensive income (FVOCI). EIR is calculated by considering all costs and incomes attributable to acquisition of a financial asset or assumption of a financial liability and it represents a rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash payments/receipts through the expected life of the financial asset/financial liability to the gross carrying amount of a financial asset or to the amortised cost of a financial liability.

The Company recognises interest income by applying the EIR to the gross carrying amount of financial assets other than credit-impaired assets. In case of credit-impaired financial assets regarded as 'stage 3', the Company recognises interest income on the amortised cost net of impairment loss of the financial asset at EIR. If the financial asset is no longer credit-impaired, the Company reverts to calculating interest income on a gross basis.

Delayed payment interest (penal interest) levied on customers for delay in repayments/non payment of contractual cashflows is recognised on realisation.

b) Recognition of revenue from sale of goods or services

Revenue (other than for Financial Instruments within the scope of Ind AS 109) is measured at an amount that reflects the considerations, to which an entity expects to be entitled in exchange for transferring goods or services to customer, excluding amounts collected on behalf of third parties.

Revenue from contract with customer for rendering services is recognised at a point in time when performance obligation is satisfied.

c) Dividend Income

Dividend income from investments is recognised when the shareholder's rights to receive payment have been established.

3.3 Employee benefits

(a) Short-term obligations

Liabilities for wages, salaries and other benefits that are expected to be settled wholly within 12 months after the end of the period in which the employees render the related service are recognised in respect of employees' services up to the end of the reporting period and are measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liabilities are settled. The liabilities are presented as current employee benefit obligations in the balance sheet.

(b) Post employment obligations

Compensated absences

Accumulated compensated absences which are expected to be availed or encashed or contributed within the 12 months from the end of the year are treated as short term employee benefits and the balances expected to be availed or encashed or contributed beyond 12 months from the year end are treated as long term liability and are accounted on undiscounted basis.

Other short term employee benefits

Short term employee benefits are recognised as an expenses as per the Company's schemes based on the expected obligation on an undiscounted basis.

3.4 Property, Plant & Equipment:

Property, Plant & Equipment are stated at their original cost less accumulated depreciation. Cost comprises cost of acquisition, cost of improvements, borrowing costs and any attributable cost of bringing the assets to the condition for its intended use. Costs also include direct expenses incurred upto the date of capitalization/ commissioning.

On transition to Ind AS, the Company has elected to continue with the carrying value of all of its property, plant and equipment recognised as at 01 April, 2019 measured as per the previous GAAP and use that carrying value as the deemed cost of all the property, plant and equipment.

3.5 Depreciation

Depreciation has been provided on written down value method in accordance with the useful life of assets prescribed under Schedule- II of the Companies Act, 2013.

3.6 Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise of cash at banks and on hand and short-term deposits with an original maturity of three months or less, which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

For the purpose of the statement of cash flows, cash and cash equivalents consist of cash and short-term deposits, as defined above, net of outstanding bank overdrafts if any, as they are considered an integral part of the Company's cash management.



Material Accounting Policies**3.7 Provisions**

Provisions are recognised in the balance sheet when the Company has a present obligation (legal or constructive) as a result of a past event, which is expected to result in an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits which can be reliably estimated. Each provision is based on the best estimate of the expenditure required to settle the present obligation at the balance sheet date.

3.8 Income taxes

The income tax expense or credit for the period is the tax payable on the current period's taxable income based on the applicable income tax rate for each jurisdiction adjusted by changes in deferred tax assets and liabilities attributable to temporary differences and to unused tax losses.

The current income tax charge is calculated on the basis of the tax laws enacted or substantively enacted at the end of the reporting period.

Deferred income tax is provided in full, using the liability method, on temporary differences arising between the tax bases of assets and liabilities and their carrying amounts in the financial statements.

Deferred income tax is determined using tax rates (and laws) that have been enacted or substantially enacted by the end of the reporting period and are expected to apply when the related deferred income tax asset is realised or the deferred income tax liability is settled.

Deferred tax assets are recognised for all deductible temporary differences and unused tax losses only if it is probable that future taxable amounts will be available to utilise those temporary differences and losses.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are offset when there is a legally enforceable right to offset current tax assets and liabilities and when the deferred tax balances relate to the same taxation authority. Current tax assets and tax liabilities are offset where the entity has a legally enforceable right to offset and intends either to settle on a net basis, or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

Current and deferred tax is recognised in profit or loss, except to the extent that it relates to items recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity. In this case, the tax is also recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity, respectively.

3.9 Earnings per share

Earnings per share is calculated in accordance with IND AS 33 on earnings per share. It is calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the year attributable to equity share holders, by the weighted average numbers of equity shares outstanding during the year.

For the purpose of calculating diluted earnings per share, the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders and weighted average number of shares outstanding during the period are adjusted for the effects of all dilutive potential equity shares.

3.10 Inventory

The inventory consists of shares held for trading purpose and are measured as per "Ind AS-2 Inventories" at Cost or Net Realisable Value whichever is lower at the balance sheet date.

3.11 Provisions, contingent liabilities and contingent assets

Provisions are recognised only when:

- (i) an entity has a present obligation (legal or constructive) as a result of a past event; and
- (ii) it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation; and
- (iii) a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation

Provision is measured using the cash flows estimated to settle the present obligation and when the effect of time value of money is material, the carrying amount of the provision is the present value of those cash flows. Reimbursement expected in respect of expenditure required to settle a provision is recognised only when it is virtually certain that the reimbursement will be received.

Contingent liability is disclosed in case of:

- (i) a present obligation arising from past events, when it is not probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation; and
- (ii) a present obligation arising from past events, when no reliable estimate is possible. Contingent assets are disclosed where an

inflow of economic benefits is probable. Provisions, contingent liabilities and contingent assets are reviewed at each Balance Sheet date.

Where the unavoidable costs of meeting the obligations under the contract exceed the economic benefits expected to be received under such contract, the present obligation under the contract is recognised and measured as a provision.

Contingent Assets

Contingent Assets are neither recognised nor disclosed. However, when realisation of the income is virtually certain, related asset is recognised

3.12 Statement of Cash Flows

Statement of Cash Flows is prepared segregating the cash flows into operating, investing and financing activities. Cash flow from operating activities is reported using indirect method adjusting the net profit for the effects of:

- i. changes during the period in operating receivables and payables transactions of a non-cash nature;
- ii. non-cash items such as depreciation, provisions, deferred taxes, unrealised foreign currency gains and losses, and undistributed profits of associates and joint ventures; and
- iii. all other items for which the cash effects are investing or financing cash flows.

Cash and cash equivalents (including bank balances) shown in the Statement of Cash Flows exclude items which are not available for general use as on the date of Balance Sheet.

3.13 Event after reporting date

Where the events occurring after the Balance Sheet date provide evidence of conditions that existed at the end of the reporting period, the impact of such events adjusted within the financial statements. Otherwise, events after the Balance Sheet date of material size or nature are only disclosed.

B. Measurement of fair values

(ii) Valuation technique used to determine fair value

Management uses its best judgement in estimating the fair value of its financial instruments. The fair value of financial instruments that are not traded in an active market is determined using valuation techniques. The Company uses its judgments to select a variety of methods and makes assumptions that are mainly based on market conditions existing at the end of each reporting period. However, there are inherent limitations in any estimation technique. Therefore, for substantially all financial instruments, the fair value estimates presented above are not necessarily indicative of the amounts that the Company could have realised or paid in sale transactions as of respective dates. 15 Financial risk management

The Company's business activities are exposed to a variety of financial risks, namely liquidity risk, market risks and credit risk. The Company's senior management has the overall responsibility for establishing and governing the Company's financial risk management framework.

(A) Credit risk

Credit risk refers to risk that a counterparty will default on its contractual obligations resulting in financial loss to the Company. Credit risk arises primarily from financial assets such as trade receivables, bank balances and loans.

At each reporting date, the Company measures loss allowance for certain class of financial assets based on historical trend, industry practices and the business environment in which the Company operates.

Credit risk arising from balances with banks is limited because the counterparties are banks with high credit worthiness.

Credit risk arising from loans given/inter-corporate deposits (ICD) are limited due to the Borrower's profiles and historical experience of collection. All such ICDs are reviewed and assessed on a quarterly basis.

(B) Liquidity Risk

Liquidity risk is the risk that the Company will face in meeting its obligations associated with its financial liabilities. The Company's approach in managing liquidity is to ensure that it will have sufficient funds to meet its liabilities when due without incurring unacceptable losses. In doing this, management considers both normal and stressed conditions.

The Company maintained a cautious liquidity strategy, with a positive cash balance throughout the year ended 31st March, 2026 and 31st March, 2025. Cash flow from operating activities provides the funds to service the financial liabilities on a day-to-day basis. The Company regularly monitors the rolling forecasts to ensure it has sufficient cash on an on-going basis to meet operational needs. Any short-term surplus cash generated, over and above the amount required for working capital management and other operational requirements, is retained as cash and cash equivalents (to the extent required) and any excess is invested in interest bearing NCDs, bonds and other highly marketable debt investments with appropriate maturities to optimise the cash returns on investments while ensuring sufficient liquidity to meet its liabilities.

(C) Market Risk

Market Risk is the risk of loss of future earnings/future cash flows that may result from a change in the price of a financial instrument. The price of a financial instrument may fluctuate because of changes in market prices, equity prices and other market changes that effect market risk sensitive instruments. The goal of market risk management is optimization of profit and controlling the exposure to market risk within acceptable limits.

(i) **Currency Risk** is not material, as the Company's primary business activities are within India and does not have any exposure in foreign currency.

(ii) **Interest Rate Risk** is the risk that the fair value or future cash flows of a financial instruments will fluctuate because of changes in market interest rates. The Company is not exposed to the interest rate risk due to its investment in fixed rate instruments which are being carried at cost and not subject to interest rate risk.

Opinion

Material Accounting Policies

1 General Information

Deeplok Financial Services Limited (the 'Company') is a public limited Company, incorporated and domiciled in India. The equity shares of the Company are listed. The registered office of the Company is located at 11/1, Sarat Bose Road, South Block, 2nd Floor, Kolkata 700020, West Bengal, India.

The Company is Non Banking Financial Company having certificate of registration from RBI vide no-05/01925 and mainly engaged in investment in shares and securities.

The functional and presentation currency of the Company is Indian Rupee ("INR") which is the currency of the primary economic environment in which the Company operates.

The financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2026 were approved by the Board of Directors and authorised for issue on 28th May 2026.

2 Significant Accounting Policies

The material accounting policies applied by the Company in the preparation of its financial statements are listed below. Such accounting policies have been applied consistently to all the periods presented in these financial statements unless otherwise indicated.

2.1 Presentation of financial statements

The Balance Sheet, Statement of Profit and Loss and Statement of changes in Equity are prepared and presented in the format prescribed in the Division III of Schedule III to the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act"). The Statement of Cash Flows has been prepared and presented as per the requirements of Ind AS. Amounts in the financial statements are presented in Indian Rupees in Lakh.

2.2 Basis of preparation

These financial statements have been prepared to comply in all material aspects with Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS) notified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 (the Act), Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 and Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Amendment Rules, 2016 and other relevant provisions of the Act.

The Company had been preparing its financial statements upto the year 31 March 2019, as per Companies (Accounting Standard) Rules, 2006 and other relevant provisions of the Act (hereinafter referred to as Previous GAAP/Indian GAAP).

2.3 Principles of consolidation

- (i) The consolidated financial statements of Deeplok Financial Services Limited and its associate have been prepared in accordance with the Indian Accounting Standards as per the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules 2015 as amended and notified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act"), in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India and other relevant provisions of the Act. The consolidated financial statements comprise the financial statements of the Company and its associate. Associates are the entities over which the Group has significant influence. Investment in associates are accounted for using the equity method of accounting, after initially being recognised at cost.

- (ii) The Consolidated financial statements include results of the Associate of Deeplok Financial Services Limited (Parent Company), consolidated in accordance with Ind AS 110 'Consolidated Financial Statements'.

2.4 Measurement of fair values

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date, regardless of whether that price is directly observable or estimated using another valuation technique.

Fair value measurements under Ind AS are categorised into Level 1, 2, or 3 based on the degree to which the inputs to the fair value measurements are observable and the significance of the inputs to the fair value measurement in its entirety, which are described as follows:

- a) Level 1: inputs are quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the Company can access at measurement date
b) Level 2: inputs are inputs, other than quoted prices included within level 1, that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly; and
c) Level 3: inputs are unobservable inputs for the valuation of assets or liabilities that the Company can access at measurement date.



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Material Accounting Policies

2.5 Use of estimates and judgements

The preparation of financial statements requires the management of the Company to make judgements, assumptions and estimates that affect the reported balances of assets and liabilities and disclosures relating to the contingent liabilities as at the date of the financial statements and reported amounts of income and expenses for the reporting period. The application of accounting policies that require critical accounting estimates involving complex and subjective judgments and the use of assumptions in the financial statements have been disclosed as applicable in the respective notes to accounts. Accounting estimates could change from period to period. Future results could differ from these estimates. Appropriate changes in estimates are made as the Management becomes aware of changes in circumstances surrounding the estimates. Changes in estimates are reflected in the financial statements in the period in which changes are made and, if material, their effects are disclosed in the notes to the financial statements.

2.6 Income Taxes:-

The Company's tax jurisdiction is India. Significant judgements are involved in determining the provisions for income taxes including amount expected to be paid or recovered for uncertain tax positions.

3 Summary of significant accounting policies

This note provides a list of the significant accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

3.1 Financial Instruments

Financial assets and financial liabilities are recognised when the Company becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument. Financial assets and liabilities are initially measured at fair value. Transaction costs that are directly attributable to the acquisition or issue of financial assets and financial liabilities (other than financial assets and financial liabilities at fair value through profit or loss) are added to or deducted from the fair value measured on initial recognition of financial asset or financial liability. The transaction costs directly attributable to the acquisition of financial assets and financial liabilities at fair value through profit and loss are immediately recognised in the statement of profit and loss.

i) Financial Assets

Subsequent Recognition

The classification of financial assets depends on the Company's business model for managing financial assets and the contractual terms of cash flow.

The financial assets are classified in the following categories:

- a) Financial assets measured at amortised cost,
- b) financial assets measured at fair value through profit and loss (FVTPL), and
- c) financial assets measured at fair value through other comprehensive income (FVOCI).

Financial assets measured at amortised cost

Assets that are held for collection of contractual cash flows where those flows represent solely payments of principal and interest are measured at amortised cost. After initial measurement, such financial assets are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method. The losses arising from impairment are recognised in the Statement of Profit & Loss.

Trade receivables are recognised initially at fair value and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method less provision for impairment, if any.

Financial instruments measured at FVTPL

Financial instruments included within FVTPL category are measured initially as well as at each reporting period at fair value plus transaction costs as applicable. Fair value movements are recorded in Statement of Profit & Loss.

Financial assets at FVOCI

Financial assets are measured at FVOCI if these financial assets are held within a business model whose objective is achieved by both collecting contractual cash flows and selling financial assets and the contractual terms of the financial asset give rise on specified dates to cash flows that are solely payments of principal and interest on the principal amount outstanding.

Investment in Bonds (other than Tax free) and Mutual fund

Investment in Equity Oriented Mutual Funds, Debt Oriented Mutual fund and Bonds (other than Tax free) are classified as FVTPL and measured at fair value with all changes recognised in the statement of profit and loss.

Investment in Tax Free Bonds and Non- Convertible Preference Shares

Investment in Tax Free Bonds and Non- Convertible Preference Shares are measured at Cost.

Investment in Equity

Investment in Equity are classified as FVTOCI and measured at fair value with all changes recognised in Other Comprehensive Income.

Investments in Associates

The Company has elected to measure Investment in associates at cost.

Other Unquoted Equity Investments

The Company has elected to measure Investment in Unquoted Equity Shares at cost.

De-recognition of financial assets

The company de-recognises a financial asset when the contractual rights to the cash flows for the financial assets expires or it transfer the financial assets and such transfer qualifies for de- recognition under Ind AS 109- Financial instruments.

All investments other than those disclosed otherwise are carried at cost less accumulated impairment losses, if any. Where an indication of impairment exists, the carrying amount of the investment is assessed and is written down immediately to its recoverable amount. On disposal of such investments, the difference between net disposal proceeds and the carrying amounts are recognised in the Statement of Profit and Loss.

Impairment of financial assets

The Company assesses on a forward looking basis the expected credit losses associated with its assets carried at amortised cost. The impairment methodology applied depends on whether there has been a significant increase in credit risk.

Only for Loans the implied approach of life time expected credit losses is recognised from initial recognition of the receivables as required by Ind AS 109- financial instruments.

Impairment loss allowance recognised / reversed during the year is charged / written back to Statement of Profit & Loss.

Where a financial instrument includes both a drawn and an undrawn component and the Company cannot identify the ECL on the loan commitment separately from those on the drawn component, the Company presents a combined loss allowance for both components under "provisions".

**ii) Financial liabilities
Subsequent Measurement**

Financial liabilities are subsequently carried at amortized cost using the effective interest method.

Borrowings are initially recognised at fair value, net of transaction costs incurred. Borrowings are subsequently measured at amortised cost. Any difference between the proceeds (net of transaction costs) and the redemption amount is recognised in profit or loss over the period of the borrowings using effective interest method.

Borrowings are classified as current liabilities unless the company has an unconditional right to defer settlement of the liability for at least 12 months after the reporting period. Where there is a breach of a material provision of a long term loan arrangement on or before the end of the reporting period with the effect that the liability becomes payment on demand on the reporting date, the entity does not classify the liability as current, if the lender agreed, after the reporting period and before the approval of the financial statement for issue, not to demand payment as a consequence of the breach.

For Trade and other payables maturing within one year from the balance sheet date, the carrying amount approximates fair value to short-term maturity of these instruments.

Derecognition of financial liabilities

The Company derecognises financial liabilities when, and only when, the Company's obligations are discharged, cancelled or they expire or it transfer the financial assets and such transfer qualifies for de-recognition under Ind AS 109- Financial instruments.

All investments other than those disclosed otherwise are carried at cost less accumulated impairment losses, if any. Where an indication of impairment exists, the carrying amount of the investment is assessed and is written down immediately to its recoverable amount. On disposal of such investments, the difference between net disposal proceeds and the carrying amounts are recognised in the Statement of Profit and Loss.

Offsetting Financial instruments

Financial assets and liabilities are offset and the net amount is reported in the balance sheet where there is a legally enforceable right to offset the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis or realise the asset and settle the liability subsequently. The legally enforceable right must not be contingent on future events and must be enforceable in the normal course of business and in event of default, insolvency or bankruptcy of the company or the counter party.

3.2 Income recognition

a) Interest income

The Company recognises interest income using Effective Interest Rate (EIR) on all financial assets subsequently measured at amortised cost or fair value through other comprehensive income (FVOCI). EIR is calculated by considering all costs and incomes attributable to acquisition of a financial asset or assumption of a financial liability and it represents a rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash payments/receipts through the expected life of the financial asset/financial liability to the gross carrying amount of a financial asset or to the amortised cost of a financial liability.

The Company recognises interest income by applying the EIR to the gross carrying amount of financial assets other than credit-impaired assets. In case of credit-impaired financial assets regarded as 'stage 3', the Company recognises interest income on the amortised cost net of impairment loss of the financial asset at EIR. If the financial asset is no longer credit-impaired, the Company reverts to calculating interest income on a gross basis.

Delayed payment interest (penal interest) levied on customers for delay in repayments/non payment of contractual cashflows is recognised on realisation.

b) Recognition of revenue from sale of goods or services

Revenue (other than for Financial Instruments within the scope of Ind AS 109) is measured at an amount that reflects the considerations, to which an entity expects to be entitled in exchange for transferring goods or services to customer, excluding amounts collected on behalf of third parties. Revenue from contract with customer for rendering services is recognised at a point in time when performance obligation is satisfied.

c) Dividend Income

Dividend income from investments is recognised when the shareholder's rights to receive payment have been established.

3.3 Employee benefits

(a) Short-term obligations

Liabilities for wages, salaries and other benefits that are expected to be settled wholly within 12 months after the end of the period in which the employees render the related service are recognised in respect of employees' services up to the end of the reporting period and are measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liabilities are settled. The liabilities are presented as current employee benefit obligations in the balance sheet.

**(b) Post employment obligations
Compensated absences**

Accumulated compensated absences which are expected to be availed or encashed or contributed within the 12 months from the end of the year are treated as short term employee benefits and the balances expected to be availed or encashed or contributed beyond 12 months from the year end are treated as long term liability and are accounted on undiscounted basis.

Other short term employee benefits

Short term employee benefits are recognised as an expenses as per the Company's schemes based on the expected obligation on an undiscounted basis.



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Material Accounting Policies

3.4 Property, Plant & Equipment:

Property, Plant & Equipment are stated at their original cost less accumulated depreciation. Cost comprises cost of acquisition, cost of improvements, borrowing costs and any attributable cost of bringing the assets to the condition for its intended use. Costs also include direct expenses incurred upto the date of capitalization/ commissioning. On transition to Ind AS, the Company has elected to continue with the carrying value of all of its property, plant and equipment recognised as at 01 April, 2019 measured as per the previous GAAP and use that carrying value as the deemed cost of all the property, plant and equipment.

3.5 Depreciation

Depreciation has been provided on written down value method in accordance with the useful life of assets prescribed under Schedule- II of the Companies Act, 2013.

3.6 Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise of cash at banks and on hand and short-term deposits with an original maturity of three months or less, which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

For the purpose of the statement of cash flows, cash and cash equivalents consist of cash and short-term deposits, as defined above, net of outstanding bank overdrafts if any, as they are considered an integral part of the Company's cash management.

3.7 Provisions

Provisions are recognised in the balance sheet when the Company has a present obligation (legal or constructive) as a result of a past event, which is expected to result in an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits which can be reliably estimated. Each provision is based on the best estimate of the expenditure required to settle the present obligation at the balance sheet date.

3.8 Income taxes

The income tax expense or credit for the period is the tax payable on the current period's taxable income based on the applicable income tax rate for each jurisdiction adjusted by changes in deferred tax assets and liabilities attributable to temporary differences and to unused tax losses.

The current income tax charge is calculated on the basis of the tax laws enacted or substantively enacted at the end of the reporting period.

Deferred income tax is provided in full, using the liability method, on temporary differences arising between the tax bases of assets and liabilities and their carrying amounts in the financial statements.

Deferred income tax is determined using tax rates (and laws) that have been enacted or substantially enacted by the end of the reporting period and are expected to apply when the related deferred income tax asset is realised or the deferred income tax liability is settled.

Deferred tax assets are recognised for all deductible temporary differences and unused tax losses only if it is probable that future taxable amounts will be available to utilise those temporary differences and losses.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are offset when there is a legally enforceable right to offset current tax assets and liabilities and when the deferred tax balances relate to the same taxation authority. Current tax assets and tax liabilities are offset where the entity has a legally enforceable right to offset and intends either to settle on a net basis, or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

Current and deferred tax is recognised in profit or loss, except to the extent that it relates to items recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity. In this case, the tax is also recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity, respectively.

3.9 Earnings per share

Earnings per share is calculated in accordance with IND AS 33 on earnings per share. It is calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the year attributable to equity share holders, by the weighted average numbers of equity shares outstanding during the year.

For the purpose of calculating diluted earnings per share, the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders and weighted average number of shares outstanding during the period are adjusted for the effects of all dilutive potential equity shares.

3.10 Inventory

The inventory consists of shares held for trading purpose and are measured as per "Ind AS-2 Inventories" at Cost or Net Realisable Value whichever is lower at the balance sheet date.

3.11 Provisions, contingent liabilities and contingent assets

Provisions are recognised only when:

- (i) an entity has a present obligation (legal or constructive) as a result of a past event; and
- (ii) it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation; and
- (iii) a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation

Provision is measured using the cash flows estimated to settle the present obligation and when the effect of time value of money is material, the carrying amount of the provision is the present value of those cash flows. Reimbursement expected in respect of expenditure required to settle a provision is recognised only when it is virtually certain that the reimbursement will be received.

Contingent liability is disclosed in case of:

- (i) a present obligation arising from past events, when it is not probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation; and
- (ii) a present obligation arising from past events, when no reliable estimate is possible. Contingent assets are disclosed where an inflow of economic benefits is

probable. Provisions, contingent liabilities and contingent assets are reviewed at each Balance Sheet date.

Where the unavoidable costs of meeting the obligations under the contract exceed the economic benefits expected to be received under such contract, the present obligation under the contract is recognised and measured as a provision.

Contingent Assets

Contingent Assets are neither recognised nor disclosed. However, when realisation of the income is virtually certain, related asset is recognised

3.12 Statement of Cash Flows

Statement of Cash Flows is prepared segregating the cash flows into operating, investing and financing activities. Cash flow from operating activities is reported using indirect method adjusting the net profit for the effects of:

- i. changes during the period in operating receivables and payables transactions of a non-cash nature;
 - ii. non-cash items such as depreciation, provisions, deferred taxes, unrealised foreign currency gains and losses, and undistributed profits of associates and joint ventures; and
 - iii. all other items for which the cash effects are investing or financing cash flows.
- Cash and cash equivalents (including bank balances) shown in the Statement of Cash Flows exclude items which are not available for general use as on the date of Balance Sheet.

3.13 Event after reporting date

Where the events occurring after the Balance Sheet date provide evidence of conditions that existed at the end of the reporting period, the impact of such events adjusted within the financial statements. Otherwise, events after the Balance Sheet date of material size or nature are only disclosed.

(II) Valuation technique used to determine fair value

Management uses its best judgement in estimating the fair value of its financial instruments. The fair value of financial instruments that are not traded in an active market is determined using valuation techniques. The Company uses its judgments to select a variety of methods and makes assumptions that are mainly based on market conditions existing at the end of each reporting period. However, there are inherent limitations in any estimation technique. Therefore, for substantially all financial instruments, the fair value estimates presented above are not necessarily indicative of the amounts that the Company could have realised or paid in sale transactions as of respective dates. 15 Financial risk management

The Company's business activities are exposed to a variety of financial risks, namely liquidity risk, market risks and credit risk. The Company's senior management has the overall responsibility for establishing and governing the Company's financial risk management framework.

(A) Credit risk

Credit risk refers to risk that a counterparty will default on its contractual obligations resulting in financial loss to the Company. Credit risk arises primarily from financial assets such as trade receivables, bank balances and loans.

At each reporting date, the Company measures loss allowance for certain class of financial assets based on historical trend, industry practices and the business environment in which the Company operates.

Credit risk arising from balances with banks is limited because the counterparties are banks with high credit worthiness.

Credit risk arising from loans given/inter-corporate deposits (ICD) are limited due to the Borrower's profiles and historical experience of collection. All such ICDs are reviewed and assessed on a quarterly basis.

(B) Liquidity Risk

Liquidity risk is the risk that the Company will face in meeting its obligations associated with its financial liabilities. The Company's approach in managing liquidity is to ensure that it will have sufficient funds to meet its liabilities when due without incurring unacceptable losses. In doing this, management considers both normal and stressed conditions.

The Company maintained a cautious liquidity strategy, with a positive cash balance throughout the year ended 31st March, 2026 and 31st March, 2025. Cash flow from operating activities provides the funds to service the financial liabilities on a day-to-day basis. The Company regularly monitors the rolling forecasts to ensure it has sufficient cash on an on-going basis to meet operational needs. Any short-term surplus cash generated, over and above the amount required for working capital management and other operational requirements, is retained as cash and cash equivalents (to the extent required) and any excess is invested in interest bearing NCDs, bonds and other highly marketable debt investments with appropriate maturities to optimise the cash returns on investments while ensuring sufficient liquidity to meet its liabilities.

(C) Market Risk

Market Risk is the risk of loss of future earnings/future cash flows that may result from a change in the price of a financial instrument. The price of a financial instrument may fluctuate because of changes in market prices, equity prices and other market changes that effect market risk sensitive instruments. The goal of market risk management is optimization of profit and controlling the exposure to market risk within acceptable limits.

(i) Currency Risk is not material, as the Company's primary business activities are within India and does not have any exposure in foreign currency.

(ii) Interest Rate Risk is the risk that the fair value or future cash flows of a financial instruments will fluctuate because of changes in market interest rates. The Company is not exposed to the interest rate risk due to its investment in fixed rate instruments which are being carried at cost and not subject to interest rate risk.
